### 1. Purpose

Lewis-Clark State College (LC State) is committed to maintaining a safe, respectful, and secure campus environment for all students, employees, and visitors. To protect college property, preserve historical and archaeological resources, and prevent unauthorized excavation or removal of items, the use of recreational and/or personal metal detectors or any metal-detecting devices is strictly prohibited on all LC State property. This policy does not apply to commercial or contracted metal detection.

### 2. Scope

This prohibition applies to all individuals, including students, employees, visitors, contractors, and hobbyists, and covers all outdoor and indoor areas owned, leased, or controlled by LC State. Metal detection activities, including scanning, digging, probing, or artifact recovery, are not permitted under any circumstances unless expressly authorized in writing by the president or a vice president at LC State. **Non-Compliance**

Unauthorized metal detection may result in disciplinary action, removal from campus, and/or referral to law enforcement if damage, theft, or disturbance of grounds occurs. LC State reserves the right to enforce this policy to ensure the protection of campus facilities, landscaping, utilities, and culturally significant resources.
